Dear Chairman Abubakar:

Thank you for your letter dated 16<sup>th</sup> January 2019 and received by GE via e-mail on 31 January 2019, regarding GE's potential involvement in the proposed Lamu power facility. GE appreciates and shares your focus on environmental and social issues.

Despite some erroneous reports in the media, GE has no ownership interest in the Lamu project. Under the Collaboration Agreement, GE has the opportunity to acquire a 20% equity interest in the Lamu project. However, before GE would invest any equity in the project, it would need to conduct comprehensive due diligence related to the project, including, but not limited to, an independent assessment of the environmental and social impacts of the project and the mitigation that would be required to be put in place to address any such impacts. Once this assessment is completed, GE would need to review this and a host of other information before seeking the necessary internal approvals to move forward with this potential equity investment.

We hope this clarifies the status of GE's potential involvement in the project. Thank you for your interest and for this opportunity to provide more information.
